WHO GLOSS Study



We are very pleased to announce that for the first time, UKOSS will be participating in a World Health Organisation study! The GLOSS (Global Maternal Sepsis) study will be collecting information worldwide about all women admitted with infection or suspected infection during or up to six weeks after pregnancy for ONE WEEK ONLY between 28th November and 4th December 2017. The UK is one of 58 countries globally chosen to participate. The GLOSS study is part of the World health Organisation "Global Maternal and Neonatal Sepsis Initiative" which has the overall goal of accelerating reduction of preventable maternal and newborn deaths related to sepsis.

The latest estimates suggest that infections are the underlying cause of 11% of maternal deaths and about 25% of newborn deaths worldwide, but the true burden of maternal infection and its complications is not well known. As is the case for other maternal conditions, the main reason for this uncertainty is the absence of standard definitions, identification criteria and measurement tools. In order to reduce the burden of maternal and neonatal infections it is necessary to have actionable identification criteria and optimise prevention and treatment of these conditions; improving our understanding of epidemiological and contextual factors will also contribute to that.

Primary objectives of the GLOSS study include:

- 1. To develop and validate a set of criteria for identification of possible severe maternal infection (presumed maternal sepsis);
- To develop and validate a set of criteria for identification maternal sepsis (confirmed sepsis);
- 3. To assess the frequency and the outcomes of maternal sepsis in high resource and low resource countries;
- 4. To assess the frequency of use of a core set of practices recommended for prevention, early identification and management of maternal sepsis.

New Study: Fibrinogen in Deficiency in Pregnancy

New study, Fibrinogen in Pregnancy, will begin collecting cases in November 2017. This will appear on reports until October 2018. This study will include all pregnant women identified as having a plasma fibrinogen of <2g/L at any point in pregnancy or immediately postpartum (up to first hospital discharge after the end of pregnancy).
