





Extremely Preterm Prelabour Rupture of Membranes (EPPROM) Study Results published as a preprint

EPPROM (before 23 weeks) is a rare complication of pregnancy that carries significant maternal morbidity, neonatal morbidity and neonatal mortality. It complicates 30-40% of all preterm births. UK clinical guidance for the management of premature rupture of membranes exists for pregnancies over 24 weeks, therefore expectant mothers in the UK who experience EPPROM are presented with a huge variation in information on prognosis and advice on termination.

Within an 18 month period this study was notified of 330 women with singleton and 38 women with multiple pregnancies who experienced preterm premature rupture of membranes between 16+0 and 22+6 weeks gestation. It was found that for singleton pregnancies the live birth rate was 44% (potential range 30 to 60%) and infant survival to discharge was 26% (potential range 12 to 49%). It was found that 18% (potential range 12 to 49%) of infants survived without severe morbidity. For women with singleton pregnancies, the maternal sepsis rate was 12% and 26% for women with twin pregnancies. Surgery for placental removal was 20% and 14% respectively.

This study concluded that pregnancies with EPPROM can have favourable outcomes, however morbidity and mortality rates remain high for mothers and infants in this cohort. These data can be used counsel women and their families who are experiencing EPPROM prior to 23 weeks gestation and to underpin further research into complex pathologies related to this condition (such as sepsis).

- New study starting

New study starting this month! Long-term non-invasive ventilation in pregnancy

- Management of pregnant women on long-term non-invasive ventilation (NIV) or continuous positive airway
 pressure (CPAP) therapy poses a challenge in terms of worsening respiratory symptoms as a consequence of
 anatomical and physiological changes occurring in pregnancy.
- There is currently no evidence to guide the management of patients who require NIV/CPAP therapy from pre-conception to postpartum and there is limited evidence of the impact on the fetus.
- This study will determine the proportion of pregnant women presenting to obstetric services who are already established on NIV/CPAP and examine the management and perinatal outcomes of these women and their babies.

Surveillance period

1st April 2023 – 31st March 2025

Case definition

Any pregnant woman who commenced non-invasive ventilation (NIV) or continuous positive airway pressure (CPAP) for a long-term condition, either prior to or during their current pregnancy, and who are booked for antenatal care in a UK obstetric unit.



Excluded: Women commencing NIV/CPAP for an acute condition such as Covid-19 infection.
